ALLA SCALA THEATRE MUSEUM

In 1816, the famous French writer Sthendal, who was in love with Milan, described it as follows: "For me, it is the first theatre in the world, because it is the one that procures the greatest pleasures from music... and as for the architecture, it is impossible to imagine anything greater, more solemn and new..."

La Scala, one of the best known and most visited monuments in Milan, is one of the most famous theatres in the world, both because of the artists who have linked their name to it and because it was, from its opening, a prestigious venue for the city's social life.

Originally, from the boxes, furnished according to the taste of the individual owners, people attended shows, dined, even cooked, gambled, and even held business and social gatherings. Through a large collection of portraits, relics,



busts, documents, playbills, the Museo del Teatro Scala offers the possibility to relive the history, anecdotes, and curiosities of those who were protagonists or famous patrons of the most famous opera house in the world!



From the writer **Alessandro Manzoni** to **Giuseppe Verdi**, from the divine **Maria Callas** to the graceful **Carla Fracci**, La Scala link his history to so many legendary protagonists.
