LEONARDO, TITIAN, CARAVAGGIO AND RAFFAELLO: THE BEAUTY OF THE AMBROSIAN PICTURE GALLERY

The 'Atlantic Codex sheets' and the 'Portrait of a Musician' by Leonardo da Vinci, the 'Adoration of the Magi' by Titian, the 'Basket of Fruit' by Caravaggio, the 'Cartoon of the School of Athens' that Raphael made in preparation for the fresco in the Vatican rooms: these are just some of the great masterpieces that you can admire in the special rooms of the Pinacoteca Ambrosiana, one of the most visited galleries in Milan and the first museum to be opened to the public in Italy.

Let's enjoy the incredible collections housed in the **Palazzo dell'Ambrosiana** where the noble Cardinal Federico Borromeo had his Library set up in 1600, a rich collection of precious books and manuscripts to which he added, in 1618, the private collection of 250 paintings, the first nucleus of the future Pinacoteca Ambrosiana.
