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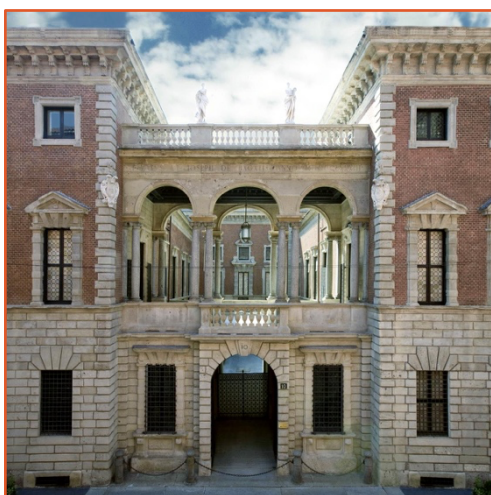


## IDEAS FOR SELF GUIDED TOUR

### A PLUNGE INTO THE RENAISSANCE: TOUR OF CASA BAGATTI VALSECCHI

Fancy a visit to the famous *Quadrilatero della Moda*? Then we recommend a stop at the **Casa Museo Bagatti Valsecchi**. The Palazzo, located in the heart of Milan, houses one of the most important and best-preserved house museums in Europe.

The Museum offers highly evocative rooms, where precious **Renaissance collections** are gathered in keeping with the original layout inspired by the noble dwellings of sixteenth-century Lombardy: in keeping with this choice, everything from paintings on canvas to frescoes, from sculptures to armour, from glass to tapestries speak to us of this era.



The mansion was built at the end of the 19th century by brothers Giuseppe and Fausto Bagatti Valsecchi, who planned to transform their palace on the corner of Via Santo Spirito and Via del Gesù into a sort of evocation of 16th-century Lombard noble palaces.

The interiors of the house amaze us because they are furnished with carefully selected antiques or with pieces made ad hoc by Lombard craftsmen to faithfully reconstruct the Renaissance atmosphere.
